

## **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE**

Welcome to our second semester! It's hard to believe that we are already half-way through the school year, but here we are finishing the second week of our second semester. Students and staff have worked hard to close out the first semester strong and to settle into the second half of the school year. As you know, semester one final report cards were published last Friday. If you have not yet had a chance to look, please be sure to login to MyEd BC to review the report card with your student. I extend sincere thanks to our staff for helping our students to get settled into the new semester so quickly and for making the transition so smooth.

While we are half-way through the school year, we are already planning for next year. Our course planning process is well under way. We have already hosted some parent and student information sessions and we will continue to host more information sessions with our students and families next week. Please see the detailed schedule in this newsletter for the important and upcoming dates related to course planning.

This month we have an intensified focus as a school and as a District in terms of celebrating diversity and inclusion. February is Black History Month. Our staff have collaborated to put together a variety of activities that classroom teachers may use to facilitate discussions and learning within the classroom which celebrates some of the accomplishments of Black Canadians.

From February 20 to 24, our students and staff will be participating in various activities, celebrations, commemorations and learning to build upon our understanding of respect and diversity and how it impacts our own actions, our peers, community, and country. Students and staff will be encouraged to show their appreciation of Diversity and Respect Week. I look forward to sharing some of the activities and highlights in our next newsletter.

Yesterday, we hosted a virtual student assembly where we focused on two key areas:

- 1) Semester 2 Reset
- 2) PLC Implementation

In the Semester 2 Reset portion of our assembly we reminded students of our expectations as a school community and the collective ownership and responsibility that we all have to take care of our school and take care of each other. In response to student feedback, we have adjusted our practices around students leaving the classroom during class time (to access washrooms or other areas of the building) by implementing a hall pass system. This implementation will start on Monday. As always, we monitor the implementation process and adjust as needed based on our observations as a staff and

feedback from our students. The <u>PLC</u> Implementation section of the assembly, we shared our upcoming plan for implementing HUB Time. I am hoping that you all had a chance to review the letter that we sent home yesterday both from the District and from us, as a school, explaining the details and the purpose of this new initiative. There is also a fantastic student created video that helps to clarify what the expectations are for students during this time.




