

# PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

On September 29<sup>th</sup>, we honoured the <u>National Day for Truth and Reconciliation</u>. In addition to wearing orange, Ms. Brasnett, our Indigenous Worldviews and Perspectives department head, Ms. Beaudry, and Ms. Brasnett's English First People's 12 class and BC First People's 12 class put together a fantastic learning opportunity for our staff and students to do together. Students were asked to put together, as a class, a collaborative Orange Shirt Day poster.

As students were constructing their collaborative poster, staff had a number of resources available to them to help facilitate conversations and discussion. Here is a sample of those resources:

There are two critical pieces to Truth and Reconciliation, First, the idea of Truth, This is a necessary first step to take as a non-Indigenous person in terms of listening and learning about the generational impacts of residential schools on Indigenous families and culture. One of the misconceptions about this first idea is that we have learned the truth already and we don't need to do that anymore. Seeking to understand is something that will always be a part of this important day and a critical piece to Truth and Reconciliation. The process will be ongoing, and understanding and compassion will continue to deepen. Second, the idea of reconciliation. What steps and actions can we take as non-Indigenous people, and as a society to work towards reconciliation? These are important questions that our students and staff considered as part of the learning and activities that were put together for Orange

Shirt Day and the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

Thank you again to Ms. Brasnett, Ms. Beaudry and our English 12 First Peoples and BC First Peoples 12 classes for putting together a rich learning opportunity for our staff and students.

On Thursday, October 12 our students and staff will be engaging in our Informal Learning Update Day. All our students will be getting an update from all their semester courses. This is a great opportunity for families to connect with their children about their progress. We would encourage you to ask your children for their Informal Learning Update when they arrive home. The Informal Learning Update can also serve as a tool for discussion at our upcoming Parent/Teacher Interviews.

Those interviews will take place the following week on October 25 and 26. Separate, detailed information will be communicated about how to sign up and the details in terms of schedule. Parents will be able to schedule in-person appointments with teachers. If anyone needs a phone call appointment or a Teams (online) appointment, please reach out to the teacher directly to arrange a day and time. I do encourage you to please make those connections with your child's teachers. It is an invaluable way to stay involved and informed with your student's education and also have any questions answered about your child's progress.

As we enter the weekend, we continue to have wonderful, summer-like weather. I hope you and your family have a chance to connect, relax and consider and appreciate the people and things in your lives for which you are thankful.
