






Wednesday of next week is National Indigenous Veterans Day. This is a day of remembrance and commemoration of the contributions of Indigenous veterans in WWI, WWII, as well as the Korean War. National Indigenous Veterans Day began in Winnipeg in 1994 when Indigenous veterans were not previously recognized in Remembrance Day activities and is now celebrated in many communities across Canada. Over 12,000 Indigenous people are estimated to have volunteered in all three wars, including 7,000 First Nations members, and approximately 300 died during these conflicts. We will have a panel of school and community professionals available for a question-and-answer period after the viewing. Below is a synopsis of *Screenagers: Under the Influence*.

Screenagers Under the Influence, the third feature documentary in the Screenagers trilogy, delves into how the tech revolution has reshaped adolescence and its effects on substance use. The film debunks myths and depicts strategies parents and schools can use to encourage healthy decision-making, support teen mental health, set limits, and create healthy home environments. The film also includes many ways young people are using their wisdom and strength to help each other and themselves through this complicated terrain around substance use.

While most documentaries about substance use focus on severe addiction, Screenagers: Under the Influence fills a pressing need for a film that explores more common scenarios. The film is grounded in teens' current reality of being flooded by images on social media, movies, and TV shows about vaping, drugs, and alcohol.

Like the first two Screenager films, Screenagers Under the Influence interweaves cutting-edge science with personal stories to create an informative and entertaining film experience for young people and adults alike. Screenagers Under the Influence focuses on practical solutions for keeping our teens safe in a changing world.

Choose either the full portrait sitting (\$50) **or** yearbook only sitting (no charge). Please sign up for <u>ONE</u> photo slot only.

Check the box next to the time slot and type of photo you would like. At the bottom of the screen, click on the "submit and sign-up" button. You will then complete your registration and that's it. You're done!

If you choose the full portrait option, the sitting fee is \$50 and must be paid at the time you book your appointment. This option will allow you to have both the formal grad portraits as well as the casual photo sitting. Your 16 proofs will be available for viewing online about one week after all photos are completed.

The yearbook only option is **free**, but you still must sign up in the **yearbook only** slots to have your formal portrait taken. This will ensure your photo will be included in the yearbook and all other special grad related events.




