The anonymous art show at North Van Arts is designed as a fundraiser for the gallery to aid in the running of art programs and the general workings of the gallery. Artists can submit up to three canvases that must be eight inches square. The pieces sell for \$100 with half the proceeds going to the gallery and half to the artist.



Over 30 WGSS students participated this year, and many have sold their paintings. The show is online and at the gallery, but all sales are done online. Last year we approximately the same number of students participating, and the show raised over \$46000 featuring over 700 paintings from all levels of artists from the community. It was an exciting event with the students being able to sell their work and for some it was the first time they have painted in acrylics and sold anything. Using art to help raise funds for the arts is a very satisfying experience.












November 22 was National Kimchi Day! Our Korean Culture Club spoiled WGSS in bringing Kimchi and Ramen for 100s of Gators!
